CREW LEADER INTERNSHIP APPLICATION

The Racine Area Youth Farm Corps is seeking an energetic young adult (ages 20 – 26) to lead a team of area high school students to grow, cook, promote and market healthy food raised on a local farm. Successful candidates will be hardworking team players interested in organic agriculture, healthy food, leadership development and working with youth. The Eco-Justice center looks to carry its environmental stewardship into the future by equipping tomorrow's conservation leaders with the skill necessary to sustain a vibrant local food movement. Be part of cultivating a sustainable local food and farming movement.

Racine Area Youth Farm Corps Crew Leader - Position Details

Who: Adults (ages 20 – 26) who are energetic, reliable, and have a demonstrated interest in sustainable agriculture and working with youth. Applicants must be willing to work outdoors in all conditions and have reliable transportation.

What: Work on the farm to grow, eat and distribute vegetables through farmers' market sales and community donations. Serve as an empowering leader for a crew of 4 youth, ages 16-18. You will also occasionally lead and interact with summer camp youth ages 6-14. Develop leadership skills while working within a collaborative team. You will be growing using sustainable organic practices in the field and in a hoop house: plant, cultivate, harvest, wash/pack along with farmer market setup and sales. Included in farm work is daily animal care and barn yard chores for alpaca, goats, and fowl.

When*: The complete internship includes 12 weeks of paid work hours from April through August, anticipate a total of approximately 480 hours of work. Normal shift begins at 7:30 am and ends by 3:30 pm
Paid on the job training (minimum 2 hour commitment - up to 4 hour sessions) begins in April-May on Tuesday evenings in Grayslake, IL

Youth Farm Corp farm program at Eco-Justice Center spans the summer months of June, July and August where work hours adjust based on farm demands but require availability 5 days per week, minimum 32 hrs/week and up to 40 hrs/week. Flexibility for Saturday farmers market is a plus.

Opportunity for additional hours in September and October based on availability.

* Schedule is subject to change due to farmers markets, Youth Farm Corp events, and celebrations.

Where: Eco-Justice Center, 7133 Michna Road, Racine, WI 53402.

Requirements: Must be able to bend, crouch, and stand for extended periods as farming requires strength and stamina. Ability to lift 50 lbs., work in the soil, handle farm tools, and be outside in all weather conditions. Program preference is given to residents of Racine County or outlying area.
