We have truly enjoyed our summer and fall programming and fundraisers: Farm Corps, Ecology on the Farm summer camps, Farm-to-Table, Fall Festival, and Growing Healthy field trips. The overwhelming enthusiasm and hard work of our volunteers and staff is truly amazing. We especially want to thank Grace Dougherty, a University of Notre Dame student, who spent eight weeks at Eco-Justice assisting with summer camps and Farm Corps gardens.

This is the second year Eco-Justice ran the Growing Healthy field trips in conjunction with Hawthorn Hollow and Racine Unified. We saw 650 first graders who were able to try Swiss chard, fennel, and ground cherries for the first time while learning about digestion, food, nutrition and healthy habits. The American Association of University Women (AAUW) provides several members to volunteer with running our field trips. We are so grateful to SC Johnson and Racine Community Foundation for their funding.

We have also taken time to pause and reflect on the change of seasons with our annual Fall Equinox celebration, which included a drum circle. We followed this with Eco-J's 14th Birthday Party on October 4, in which we took time to honor the memories of our founders and those who have helped over the years. We especially took time to honor Joe Weinzatl, who passed away suddenly in September. Joe was a faithful volunteer who built several fences and mowed our hay field annually. He was one of those positive people who always had a smile on his face and loved being with animals, people, and the land. He was especially fond of horses and we now have a horseshoe plaque in honor of Joe on one of the fenceposts he put up.

So many people come away with a sense of reconnecting with nature during their time here at Eco-Justice, and our mission and programming could not live on without continued support from our volunteers and donors like you.




