With the First Sunday in June, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, the big feasts that follow upon Pentecost are celebrated...there was the Trinity and then Corpus Christi.

June 2, 2024 | The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ | Mark 14:12-16, 22 "Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples? Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there."

Jesus calls us to join him in the upper room where he gifts us himself in the bread and wine. Transformed by these gifts and committed to our baptismal vows, who are those we invite to our tables? Who do we invite to share in this table of love?

June 9, 2024 | the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mk 14:12-16, 22, 26 "For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Jesus was casting out demons but his family and community thought he was doing it by the power of Beelzebub. In today's society, we would think him countercultural if not simply crazy. How are we like Jesus in casting out the darkness of our world by bringing light to darkness? How, as Spirit filled people, are we Jesus' family by doing his will of loving service?

June 16, 2024 | 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mk 4: 25-34 "...it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

Systems theory tells us, simply, that everything we do affects others and that we (including non-humans!) are connected to each other. This tells us, as Jesus illustrates here, that all our works, however small, have importance in the kingdom of God. How can we rejoice that all our works, no matter how small or insignificant in our minds, are special in the sight of God?

June 23, 2024 | 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mk 4:35-41 "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

In our current political climate, it is hard not to be terrified at the risk of our democracy. Jesus tells us to have faith. How do we choose to believe in the power of Jesus' love for us, knowing that faith in him leads to hope which leads to love and ultimately, to peace - the calming of our waters?

June 30, 2024 | 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time | Mk 5:21-24, 35b-43 "The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. And [Jesus] said...that she should be given something to eat."

Jesus brought this little girl back to those who loved her. After this miracle, he told her family to feed her. How do we recognize that small acts of love and kindness are miracles in themselves... that God works though us as we feed a hungry child or even a stray cat?
