Before Vatican II, the Feast of the Ascension was almost totally eclipsed for most of the folks in the pews. It was celebrated on a Thursday, 40 days after Easter, and we missed it because most of us were at work or in school. That is no longer the case. It is now celebrated on a Sunday, but most of us still wonder what it's all about. Yay, for Jesus...he is now safely back in heaven at his Father's side, right? Yes, it is Hooray for Jesus, but it's much more. It's about us.

Keep your eyes on the Prize. Yes, look up into the heavens as he goes, but take note of what you see. You see your own flesh and blood, transformed and glorified. You see your own DNA going straight to the side of the Father. And when our Shepherd gets there, the Father asks, "Son, where are all the rest?" And his answer? "They're coming, Father, they're coming."
